

Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate Policy and Procedure

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1. Scope

The City of Parramatta Council will provide financial assistance to Eligible Pensioners to repair or replace a dividing fence that abuts a Public Reserve or a Road, excluding front fences.

1.1 This Policy applies to all residential properties in the City of Parramatta Council (Council) local government area (LGA).

2. Purpose

Under the provisions of the Dividing Fences Act 1991 (Act), NSW Councils are exempt from contributing towards the cost of dividing fences where they abut a Public Reserve or a Road.

Despite the exemptions provided under the Act, City of Parramatta Council is committed to assisting Eligible Pensioners to repair or replace a fence where their fence abuts a Public Reserve or a Road.

2.1 This Policy provides establishes a framework of guiding principles and eligibility criteria for for Council to provide financial assistance to Eligible Pensioners seeking a contribution from City of Parramatta Council, to the cost ofto repairing or replaceing a Delividing Efence abutting a Public Reserve or a Road, excluding front fences.

3. Policy

3.1 <u>Under the provisionsPursuant to section 25 of the Dividing Fences Act 1991 (Act) (NSW), NSW Councils are is exempt from contributing towards the cost of dividing fences where they abut a Public Reserve or a Road.</u>

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- 3.2 <u>Despite the exemptions provided under the Act Dividing Fences Act 1991 (NSW), City of Parramatta Council is committed to assisting Eligible Pensioners to repair or replace a Dividing Ffence where their fence abuts a Public Reserve or a Road.</u>
- 3.3 Council will reimburse <u>Eligible Pensioners</u> 50% of repair or replacement costs of a <u>Ddividing Ffence where it abuts a Public Reserve or a Road</u>, up to a maximum amount of \$1,100.00 (including GST).
 - 3.3.1 Council will not provide financial assistance for the repair or replacement of front fences.
 - 3.3.2 The <u>Ddividing Ffence needs tomust</u> be in a condition where it warrants repair or replacement, at the discretion of Council.
 - 3.3.3 A maximum of one (1) paymentrebate will be granted per property every 15 years.

Eligibility

- 3.4 To be eligible for a contribution to the cost of a dividing fence under this Policy to apply for the Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate, the following criteria must be met:
 - (a) The applicant must own the property.
 - (b) The applicant must reside in the property.;
 - (c) The applicant must be an Eligible Pensioner. as defined by the Local Government Act;
 - (d) The property must be situated within the City of Parramatta-Council-Local Government Area LGA.;
 - (e) The property must directly abut a Public Reserve or Road.; and
 - The property must be a residential property, excluding Community

 Titled residential property, Strata Schemes, or Strata Titled residential propertiesy.;
 - (f)(g) The proposed works must be for a standard timber paling fence to a maximum height of 1.8 metres (180 centimetres).
- 3.5 An Eligible Pensioner will need to apply for a Applications for the Dividing Fence Pensioner

 Rrebate must be submitted to and approved by Council, prior to undertaking any works on the Ddividing Ffence.
- 3.6 Council has no liability for the ongoing repair and maintenance of any <u>fence</u> repaired or replaced <u>fence</u>, to which a Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate has been issued, under this Policy.

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4. Delegation

4.1 There are Administrative and/or Legislative Delegations applicable to this Policy, which are provided for in Council's Delegations Manual.

5. Procedure

When to apply

An Eligible Pensioner will need to apply for a rebate **prior** to undertaking any works on the dividing fence.

- 5.1 Applications may be made to Council using the prescribed Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate application form on Council's Online Services Portal.
 - 5.1.1 Applicants requiring assistance with completing the application form may contact Council's Property Assets, Security, and Services Unit, including by:
 - (a) phoning Council Customer Service at 1300 617 058; or
 - (b) attending Council's Customer Service Centre at Phive.
 - 5.1.2 The a Applicants must provide Council with:
 - a) aAt least two-(2) written quotations for the cost of repair or replacement of the dividing fence, which document that the proposed works meet the specifications set out by this Policy; and:
 - b) photographic evidence of the fence requiring repair or replacement.

Information required by Council

The applicant must provide Council with:

a) At least two (2) written quotations for the cost of repair or replacement of the dividing fence;

b)a) The quotations must be for a standard timber paling fence to a maximum height of 1.8 metres (180 centimetres); and

The applicant must provide photographic evidence of the fence requiring repair or replacement.

Pre-inspection

5.2 Council may inspect the <u>dividing</u> fence before <u>processing the determining a Dividing Fence</u> <u>Pensioner Rebate</u> application.

Approval

- <u>5.3</u> Where a Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate application has been If approved by Council, the applicant shouldmust:
 - (a) Undertake and pay for the repair or replacement;
 - (b) Pprovide Council with a copy of the fully paid invoice;
 - (c) Pprovide Council with a signoff from the contractor that the works have been undertaken; and
 - (d) Pprovide Council with photographic evidence of the repaired or replaced fence.

Post-inspection

5.4 Council may inspect the repaired or replaced fence prior to anyissuing the Dividing Fence Pensioner Rrebate being issued.

Other information

<u>5.5</u> The Asset Strategy and Property Management Unit of Council will maintain a database of <u>Dividing Fence Pensioner Rebate</u> applications received and rebates <u>grantedissued</u>.

Funding will be provided by the Asset Strategy & Property Management Unit.

This Policy will be managed by the Asset Strategy and Property Management Unit of Council.

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6. Definitions

Council:

City of Parramatta Council.

Eligible Pensioners:

The Local Government Act 1993 defines eligible pensioners as:

- c) Persons who receive a pension, benefit or allowance under Chapter 2 of the Social Security Act 1991 of the Commonwealth, or a service pension under Part III of the Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 of the Commonwealth, and who are entitled to a pensioner concession card issued by or on behalf of the commonwealth government: or
- d) Persons who receive a pension from the Commonwealth Department of Veterans' Affairs and are the holders of a pension concession card issued by Centrelink.

Public Reserve:

The Local Government Act 1993 defines public reserve as:

- (a) a public park, or
- (b) any land conveyed or transferred to the council under section 340A of the Local Government Act 1919, or
- (c) any land dedicated or taken to be dedicated as a public reserve under section 340C or 340D of the Local Government Act 1919, or
- (d) any land dedicated or taken to be dedicated under section 49 or 50, or
- (e) any land vested in the council, and declared to be a public reserve, under section 37AAA of the Crown Lands Consolidation Act 1913, or
- (f) any land vested in the council, and declared to be a public reserve, under section 76 of the Crown Lands Act 1989, or
- (g) a Crown reserve that is dedicated orreserved:
- (i) for public recreation or for a public cemetery, or
- (ii) for a purpose that is declared to be a purpose that falls within the scope of this definition by means of an order published in the Gazette by the Minister administering the Crown Lands Act 1989, being a Crown reserve in respect of which a council has been appointed as manager of a reserve trust for the reserve or for which no reserve trust has been established, or
- (h) land declared to be a public reserve and placed under the control of a council under section 52 of the State Roads Act 1986, or
- (i) land dedicated as a public reserve and placed under the control of a council under section 159 of the Roads Act 1993, and includes a public reserve of which a council has the control under section 344 of the Local Government Act 1919 or section 48, but does not include a common.

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Road:

The Local Government Act 1993 defines road as:

- (a) highway, street, lane, pathway, footpath, cycleway, thoroughfare, bridge, culvert, causeway, Road-ferry, ford, crossing, by-pass and trackway, whether temporary or permanent, and
- (b) any part of a Road and any part of any thing referred to in paragraph (a), and
- (c)(a) anything forming part of a road or anything forming part of any thing referred to in paragraph (a).

<u>Dividing Fence</u>	As defined by the Dividing Fences Act 1991 (NSW), means a fence		
	separating the land of adjoining owners, whether on the common		
	boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common		
	boundary.		
Eligible Pensioner	As defined in the Dictionary to the Local Government Act 1993 (NSW) (LG		
	Act) and section 134 of the Local Government General Regulation 2021		
	(NSW), means:		
	a) persons who receive a pension, benefit or		
	allowance under Chapter 2 of the Social Security		
	Act 1991 of the Commonwealth, or a service		
	pension under Part III of the Veterans' Entitlements		
	Act 1986 of the Commonwealth, and who are		
	entitled to a pensioner concession card, issued by		
	or on behalf of the commonwealth government: or		
	b) persons who receive a pension from the		
	Commonwealth Department of Veterans' Affairs		
	and who are entitled to a pensioner concession		
	card, issued by or on behalf of the		
	Commonwealth government, or		
	c) persons who have received a lump sum		
	mentioned in section 234(1)(b) of the Military		
	Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2004 of the		
	Commonwealth or are receiving a weekly amount		
	mentioned in that paragraph, and who are		
	entitled to a pensioner concession card, issued by

	and includes a public reserve of which a council has the	
	control under section 344 of the Local Government Act 1919	
	<u>or section 48, but does not include a common.</u>	
Road	As defined in the Dictionary to the LG Act, means:	
	(a) highway, street, lane, pathway, footpath, cycleway,	
	thoroughfare, bridge, culvert, causeway,	
	Road-ferry, ford, crossing, by-pass and trackway, whether	
	temporary or permanent, and	
	(b) any part of a Road and any part of any thing referred to in	
	paragraph (a), and	
	(c) any thing forming part of a road or anything forming part of	
	any thing referred to in paragraph (a).
