6	Engagement with students from UTS Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation

## Discussion Ashlee Gardner presented UTS BCII Industry Innovation Project.

Background: City of Parramatta Council has partnered with University of Technology Sydney(UTS) and invited 5 students who are currently pursuing combined degree - Bachelor of Creative Intelligence and Innovation. One of the unit in the **degree is called "Industry Innovative Project"**. A 12 week placement has been offered to the students to complete a project that focusses on:

"How can the City of Parramatta lead in integrating First Nations history storytelling and self-determination into the fabric of the city?"

The students have been in CoP for 6 weeks already and has been doing research of the community engagement results, consultation with other organisations and also seeking feedback from the First Nations Advisory Committee.

The students tabled three questions to the Committee.

Question 1:

How do you think Council can enhance the well being of and connection to Country for First Nations community members? Are there good examples from other Council areas.

The Committee suggested other Council's such as Hornsby, Blue Mountains, Blacktown & YASS Council who connects with First Nations Communities by using art that tells a story, connection to river, Federation walk, court house stories & positive stories)

Question 2: What is the level of understanding you expect from the public, and from Council, around First Nations histories, storytelling and self-determination.

The Committee expects the people to know the truth about First Nations. There is lack of engagement of traditional owners with the people. The Committee encourages Council to work in partnership with Elders to bridge the gap to explore their stories.

Question 3: What are some of the strengths and weakness with Council currents engagement with First Nation people. How can Council improve their approach.

The Committee appreciated that it was highly consulted on PHIVE. They believe that the Council has an opportunity to share its power and decision making with the Elders directly and work in partnership with them to provide modern translation of the history.

First Nations strategy is an opportunity for being consultative and collaborative and inclusive.
