Yallambi Road	<p>In acknowledgement of Yallambi, BaptistCare's first home, and the first building developed on the located on the former site. Est. 31 January 1953. The birthplace of BaptistCare, Yallambi was the first aged care centre built by the Baptist Homes Trust that was itself incorporated on 5 October 1944 to "establish and manage a home (for Elderly Ladies) and all other social service activities under the Union or that its member Churches might hereafter establish."</p>
